She said that the erstwhile Vocational School which was established in the year 1985 and later converted into CPU in 2013 has been producing academic gowns, gents' and ladies' African wear, sportswear, classic and fashionable shirts, custom-made T-shirts, corporate uniforms, laboratory coats, chef's uniform, ladies' fashion clothes and office wear for the University community, other universities, corporate bodies and members of the general public.

She declared the intention of the Unit to strive to be a leader in fashion outerwear by deploying innovation and wonderful designs to provide total customer satisfaction to the Ghanaian public and beyond. "CPU would continue to innovate, lead, enhance and provide best-value clothing products and services to customers in Ghana and worldwide," she said.

Mrs. Ghanney recounted the achievements of CPU since its establishment in the UEW. According to her, the Unit had produced ceremonial robe for the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Cape Coast, ceremonial robes for four Eminent Personalities who were awarded Honorary Doctorate Degrees by the UEW during the August, 2014 Special Congregation, 1,000 Master Degree academic gowns for students and Convocation Members of the UEW, 500 Doctoral academic gowns for UEW students and Convocation Members, 10,000 academic gowns for Bachelor Degree students amongst others. She noted that the Unit is currently equipped with 53 industrial sewing machines, three industrial neatening machines, five flat lock industrial sewing machines, five four-thread industrial sewing machines, eight domestic electric sewing machines, one fusing machine and one industrial vacuum steam iron.

UEW Management Strives to Contain Spread of Covid-19



Management of the University of Education, Winneba (UEW) is making great efforts to contain the spread of the novel Coronavirus 2019 (Covid-19) should students be asked to return to campus for academic work. This was revealed by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Pro-VC), Prof. Andy Ofori-Birikorang during a disinfection exercise initiated by Zoomlion Ghana and Citi TV at the University. Zoomlion Ghana and Citi TV with support from the Government of Ghana have been embarking on disinfection exercises in universities in the country as part of measures to contain the spread of the global disease, COVID-19. The Covid-19 disinfection team visited UEW on Thursday, 16th April, 2020 to fumigate lecture halls, Institute for Educational Research and Innovation Studies (IERIS) Block and walkways on all three campuses of the University at the Winneba Campus. Addressing the media during the exercise, Prof. Andy Ofori-Birikorang expressed Management's readiness to welcome students back on campus immediately the virus is controlled. According to him, Management had put in place a lot of stringent measures to protect staff and students from the virus.

"Since the announcement by the President that schools should close down, we have rolled out a lot of things. First, we have ensured that critical and emergency staff only come to the office. Second, we have fixed on all the walls hand sanitizer equipment fully stocked and also provided partial personal protective equipment such as nose masks and hand gloves.

Also, the University Clinic in partnership with the campus radio, Windy Bay 98.3 MHz Fm is rolling out special and sensitisation programme on the pandemic for the community," he said. He indicated that the exercise was vital in breeding confidence and assurance in the campus environment thereby reducing anxiety and panic in people. "Since this exercise has been done, it means that the anxiety, the fear and panic that comes with waking up every morning and not knowing what will happen on campus will reduce," the Pro-VC averred. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor entreated staff, the Effutu community and the public in general to adhere to laid down precautionary measures by the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the Government of Ghana.

The Leader of the disinfection team, Mr. Gideon Sogbey stated that, the purpose of the exercise was to try as much as possible to contain the spread of the covid-19 especially within the public areas. He indicated that his team consisted of 58 sprayers along with one thermal fogger and two fogger machines mounted on pick-ups.

Prof. Sarfo, particularly, described the fumigation exercise as a fitting addition to all the efforts that the College has been committed to making since it became evident that COVID-19 cases had been recorded in the country. He explained that COLTEK was already implementing very robust measures on campus to ensure that the College was free from the ravages of COVID-19. Among them, he referred to efforts that had been made to swiftly improve conditions at the College Clinic in readiness for any eventuality.

He indicated Management's provision of hand sanitisers and packs of Sante+ Medicated Wipes for all offices in the College as well as the positioning at vantage points on the campus, Veronica Buckets full of disinfectants with accompanying tissue papers for use by the College Community and all who visit the college to transact business.

All five webinars, moderated by the Ag. Director, OIA, Dr. Mavis Amo-Mensah, have seen seasoned facilitators such as the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Andy OforiBirikorang; Dean, Faculty of Business Education, Prof. Isaac Boateng; Director, IDeL. Prof. Francis Owusu-Mensah: Director, ITECPD, Prof. Dominic K. D. Mensah; Dean, FFLEC, Dr. Christiana Hammond: Director. Health Services. Dr. (Mrs.) Beth Offei-Awuku: Director. ICT Services, Dr. Ephrem Kwaa-Aidoo; Graduate Coordinator. According to the Alumni Relations Officer and Assistant Registrar, OIA, Mr. Frank Amoako Arthur the webinar series, has come to stay. He assured the University community of subsequent webinars focused on the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Initially, we planned for six but due to the exigencies of the situation, new topics had come up and we have incorporated them to the list that we had already prepared. As we said, it is a constant and continuous engagement with our stakeholders so it is going to continue until the end of the pandemic and even after the pandemic, we wish it becomes a perpetual programme of our strategic measures going forward," he affirmed.

UEW Health Services Begin Decontamination Exercise

The MoU gives Right to Play the green light to support UEW in the training of future teachers in different Faculties in the Colleges of Education and assist to capacitate the tutors who are teaching these future teachers to improve and impact the learning outcomes of Ghanaian children.

The two parties would also collaborate to conduct research in communities where the teachers are teaching and share the knowledge thereof, with universities and other players in the educational sector impact of learning through play. Again, both parties would work together to organise conferences to equip themselves with the learning outcomes and experiences of children in different schools.
